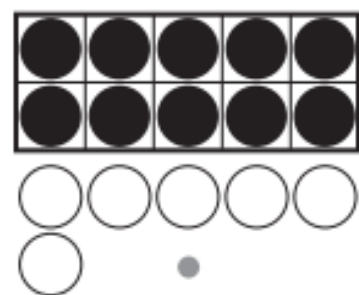
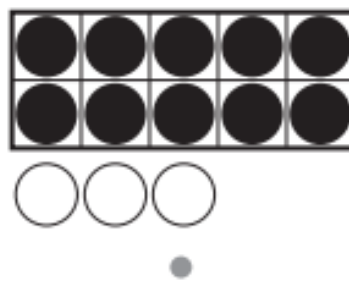
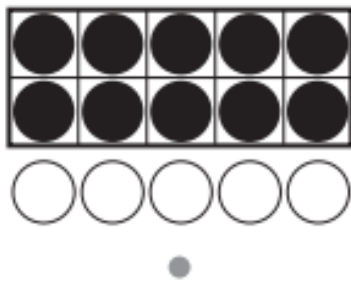
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1.OA.3 Apply properties of operations as strategies to add and subtract. For example: ...To add $2 + 6 + 4$, the second two numbers can be added to make a ten, so $2 + 6 + 4 = 2 + 10 = 12$. (Associative property of addition.) First grade students need not use formal terms for these properties.

1.OA.6 Add and subtract within 20. a. Use strategies such as counting on; making ten (for example, $8 + 6 = 8 + 2 + 4 = 10 + 4 = 14$); decomposing a number leading to a ten (for example, $13 - 4 = 13 - 3 - 1 = 10 - 1 = 9$);...

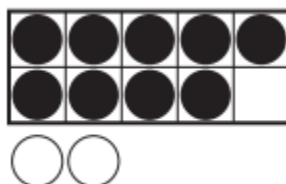

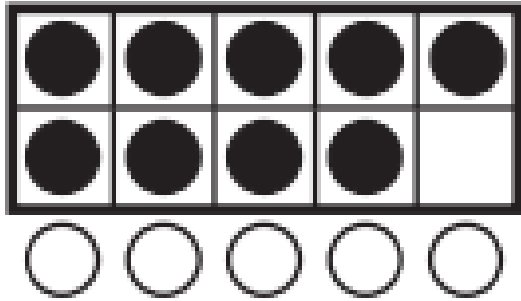
